The Community Library was founded June 3, 1944 under the Kempton Barber Shop at the northeast corner of Cherry and Vernon Street. The library was moved to the first floor of the Town Hall in 1954. In 1975, the library occupied the second and third floor of Town Hall. The Community Library on Burrer Drive opened on July 3, 1994, fifty years after the original opening of the library.

The Community Library is home to the Burrer Family Memorial Room. To promote community heritage, The Burrer Family Memorial Room and the digital library Delaware County Memory serve to collect, preserve, and make available materials that document the history and development of the Big Walnut area.

On August 5, 1800, Revolutionary War Veteran Dr. Samuel Jones used 25 land warrants to purchase 4,000 acres (1/4 Township) of the newly formed US Military Land District in the Northwest Territory. In 1802, he hired Welsh immigrant David Pugh to locate and evaluate the land. David recognized the value of the land and purchased it from Dr. Jones on February 23, 1803 for \$2650. The Federal Township containing the 4,000 acres was named Radnor Township after Pugh's home area in Wales. David platted a village named New Baltimore that changed names to Delhi in 1833 and then to Radnor in the 1870's to satisfy mail delivery requirements.

Soldiers of the American Revolution, War of 1812, Spanish American War, World War I and World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War and the Iraq War are buried in the Galena Cemetery.

Galena is popular with outdoor enthusiasts with the Hoover Boardwalk, Ruffner Park, Miller Park, Little Walnut Mudflats, Little and Big Walnut Creeks all being located in the Village. The Ohio to Erie Trail also passes through the village.
