

## OLD TOWN NAMES

**ALUM CREEK (P.O.)** – Berlin twp near where U.S. 36 & 37 crossed Alum Creek [1808-]

**ASHLEY** – Oxford twp aka OXFORD [1855-present]

**BELLPOINT** – Concord twp at the junction of Mill Creek & Scioto River [1835-present]

**BERKSHIRE** – Berkshire twp aka BERKSHIRE CORNERS [1804-present]

**BERLIN** – Berlin twp where the railroad crosses US36/37 [1850-c.1860]

**BERLIN STATION** – Berlin twp P.O. TANKTOWN; northern portion of the road in Berlin [c.1880-]

**BIG SWALE** – Claibourne twp Union Co; north of Richwood

**BOKES CREEK SETTLEMENT** – Scioto twp at the mouth of Bokes Creek on the Scioto [1805-]

**BOWETOWN** – Brown twp consisted only of Erastus Bowe & his family [1809-c.1815]

**BUDDTOWN** – Harlem twp aka HARLEM [1818-1849]

**BYHALA** – Washington twp Union Co; crossroads south central part of twp; never platted [c.1853]

**CENTERVILLE** – Harlem twp aka CENTER VILLAGE; at the intersection of Harlem's 4 sections [1848-present]

**CHESHIRE** – Berlin twp aka CONSTANTIA; PETH [1849-present]

**CONE'S MILL** – Thompson twp aka PICKERELL'S MILL, EAGLEVILLE; near the mouth of Fulton Creek on the Scioto River [1836-c.1874]

**CONSTANTIA** - Berlin twp aka PETH, CHESHIRE

**DELAWARE INDIAN VILLAGE #1** - Delaware twp near the Sulphur springs of Delaware; east end of William St.

**DELAWARE INDIAN VILLAGE #2** – Delaware twp; 400 acres west end of William St. from the sawmill to the hillside

**DELHI** – Radnor twp aka RADNOR [1833-1880]

**RADNOR** – Radnor twp aka DELHI; name changed when the village was missed by Columbus & Toledo RR

**EAST LIBERTY** – Porter twp [1836-]

**EAST ORANGE** – Orange twp aka AFRICA; East side of Alum Creek where the road narrows by the hull & the creek [c.1855-present]

**EDEN**- Brown twp aka KILBOURNE P.O.; west bank of Alum Creek 6 mi northeast of Delaware [1836-]

**EDEN STATION** – Brown twp aka LEONARDSBURG; on the Columbus, Cleveland, Cincinnati RR [c.1852]

**EDINBURG** – Scioto twp aka FAIRVIEW [c.1854-1875]

**FAIRVIEW** – Scioto twp aka EDINBURG; the CCC & Indianapolis RR passed 1 mi south at Ostrander [c.1815]

**FORT CHESHIRE** – Berlin twp; a blockhouse built in response to “the panic of 1812” [c.1812-1820]

**FREEDOM** – Orange twp; probably a town on paper only [1841-]

**GALENA** – Berkshire twp aka ZOAR [1834-present]

**GENOA CROSSROAD (P.O.)** – Galena twp when a successor to the postmaster’s job failed P.O. was moved to MAXWELL

**GOODINDALE P.O.** – Orange twp aka ORANGE STATION

**HALL’S CORNERS** – Liberty twp aka MIDDLEBURY, POWELL [1876-]

**HORSESHOE** – Polk twp Crawford Co; one of the many name for what become Galion

**HYATTSVILLE** – Liberty twp; about the center of Liberty twp [1876-present]

**INGLESBE** – Genoa twp; plot for this town never recorded

**LIBERTY SETTLEMENT**- Liberty twp along the Olentangy River in the east central portion of Liberty twp

**MAXTOWN** – Genoa twp; only reference to town on 1888 twp

**MAXWELL (P.O.)** – Genoa aka MAXWELL CORNERS, MAXTOWN; post office moved from Maxwell to Genoa Crossroads

**MILL CREEK SETTLEMENT** – Concord twp

**MILLVILLE** – Scioto twp west bank of the Scioto River about halfway bet the Marysville Pike covered bridge & the mouth of Boke's Creek [1809-]

**MINGO INDIAN VILLAGE** – Delaware twp aka PLUGGY'S TOWN

**MORTON'S CORNERS** – Bennington twp; Morrow Co aka PAGETOWN; southwest border of twp

**NEW BALTIMORE** – Radnor twp not far from DELHI [1808-1810]

**NORTON** – Marlborough twp [1806-present]

**OLIVE GREEN** – Porter twp aka KINGSTOWN CENTER P.O.; intersection of State Rd & Mt. Gilead Rd. [1837-present]

**ORANGE STATION** – Orange twp aka GOODINDALE P.O.

**OXFORD** – Oxford twp aka ASHLEY [1849-1855]

**PAGETOWN** – Bennington twp, Morrow Co aka MORTON'S CORNERS; southwest border of twp [c.1837]

**PETH** – Berlin twp aka CONSTANTIA, CHESHIRE

**PICKERELL'S MILLS** – Thompson twp aka CONE'S MILL, EAGLETOWN

**PROSPECT HILL** – Delaware twp on highland east of the Olentangy just north of Sugar Creek [1852-1880]

**RADNOR BLOCKHOUSE** – Radnor twp [c. 1812-c. 1820]

**RICH HILL** – Hilliar twp Knox Co aka HILLAR P.O.; west central part of twp [c.1862 – present]

**RIGGER'S FORD** – Scioto twp; where the bridge of Marysville Pike was located

**ROME (CORNERS)** – Berkshire twp [1836-]

**SANDVILLE** – Radnor twp

**SQUAWTOWN** – Washington twp Licking Co; Indian village 2 mi east of Utica

**SANTONTOWN** – Peru twp Morrow Co. aka WEST LIBERTY

**STARK'S CORNERS** – Kingston twp intersection of north/south Sunbury Rd. & east/west Mansfield Rd. [c. 1809]

**STEAM CORNERS** – Troy twp; Morrow Co.

**STRATFORD-ON-OLENTANGY** – Delaware twp; west bank of Olentangy River & fronted on Sandusky St.

**TANKTOWN P.O.** – Berlin twp aka BERLIN STATION; northern portion of the road in Berlin

**VANS VALLEY** – Trenton twp; a 1000 acre valley located in southwestern part of twp [1817-]

**WEST LIBERTY** – Peru twp Morrow Co. aka STANTONTOWN

**WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS** – Concord twp; on Scioto River 10 mi southwest of Delaware [c 1847-1869]

**WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS STATION** – Concord twp; western end of the iron bridge over the Scioto River 5 mi west of Delaware & 2 mi east of Ostrander for the convenience of Girls' Industrial Home [c. 1837]

**WILLIAMSVILLE** – Orange twp; on the Columbus Pike [1836]

**WINDSOR'S CORNERS** – Oxford twp [c 1824]

**ZOAR** – Berkshire twp aka GALENA [1816-1834]
